Homewood / East Hills

11/30/15 Aggravated Assault -7400 block Monticello Street, 7:05pm. Officers responded to a stabbing and found a 39 year-old female victim with a stab wound to her arm. The victim was uncooperative and refused to give officers any information. Officers eventually learned from other family members that the suspect is **Shaquaii Burgwin, 23, (Address Unknown)**. Burgwin fled the scene prior to police arrival. Officers will obtain an arrest warrant for Shaquaii Burgwin. *She will be charged with Aggravated Assault.* (229545)

11/30/15 Aggravated Assault (Domestic) – Kelly Street & N. Murtland Avenue, 6:30am. A 42 year-old female victim reported that her ex-boyfriend approached her as she was walking to the bus stop and began punching her, breaking her nose and causing facial injuries. The suspect, **Jamall O. Brimage, 44, of Homewood**, then fled the scene in a black Cadillac sedan. Officers will apply for an arrest warrant for Brimage. *He will be charged with Aggravated Assault.* (229126)

12/1/15 Burglary – 7200 block Mt. Vernon Street, Occurred between 8:00am and 12:45pm. Victim reports she returned home to find her TV was missing and DVD's were scattered on the floor. Another TV was missing from upstairs. There were no signs of forced entry. (229923)

12/6/15 Aggravated Assault (Stabbing) – Club Taboo – 8023 Bennett Street, 1:04am. A 31 year-old female victim reported that she was at the bar when an argument broke out between her and a known female, **Jasmine Harden, 22, of Verona**. The victim stated that Harden pulled a knife and stabbed her in the shoulder, then fled the scene. Officers were able to track Harden down with the help of the Plum Borough Police Dept. *Harden was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault.* The victim sustained minor injuries. (232965)

12/6/15 Aggravated Assault (Domestic) – 7100 block Apple Avenue, 10:00pm. Officers responded to a report of a violent domestic at this location. A 19 year-old female victim reported that her husband, **Jose L. Fonseca Montalvo, 37, of Homewood**, choked her then struck her hard in the ribs with a gun, before fleeing with the gun in his **dark purple Honda Accord**. Officers observed signs of injury on the victim. Officers assisted the victim with alternate housing arrangements. A warrant will

be issued for Fonseca Montalvo's arrest. He will be charged with Aggravated Assault, Simple Assault, Reckless Endangerment, and Intimidation of a Witness. (233494)

Larimer / Lincoln-Lemington

11/30/15 Burglary – 7100 block Everton Street, Occurred between 11/26 and 11/30. Victim reported she was out of town for the holiday when she received a call that her child's father had broken into her apartment. The victim's boyfriend secured her apartment. The victim returned on 11/30 to find her apartment ransacked and her couch had been slashed with a knife. Detectives are investigating. (229424)

12/1/15 Barricaded Person - 1300 Paulson Avenue, 7:00pm. Officers responded to a call for a neighbor dispute and found **Alex Perdriel, 37**, pounding on the walls of his upstairs apartment, and cursing loudly. The neighbor who called 911 advised officers that Perdriel was armed with a knife. Officers attempted to speak to Perdriel but he refused to open the door and threatened to "cut their heads off." Officers maintained a perimeter and called for SWAT. SWAT units arrived on scene and were eventually able to take Perdriel into custody. While walking him to the police car, Perdriel spit in one of the officer's faces. A surgical mask was placed over Perdriel's face and he was transported to the Allegheny County Jail. The officer was decontaminated by Paramedics on scene. *Perdriel was charged with Aggravated Assault, Terroristic Threats, and Resisting Arrest.* (230181)

12/2/15 Burglary – PNC Bank – 178 Bakery Square Blvd, 12:30am. Officers responded to a burglar alarm at the PNC Bank in Bakery Square. They arrived within minutes to find damage to the front door and a suspect inside the bank. The magnetic locks prevented the officers from entering the bank initially, and they, too, had to force entry. Once inside the bank, they were able to take the suspect into custody. The burglar was identified as **Patrick Flood, 29 (Address Unknown)**. Officers noted significant damage to the property, including a broken door, a broken window, and damage to property inside the bank. Officers also noted minor injuries to Flood, most likely sustained when forcing his way into the building. Flood was also found to be in possession of heroin and drug paraphernalia. *He was transported to the Allegheny County Jail and charged with Burglary, Criminal Mischief, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.* (230318)

Bloomfield/Garfield/Friendship

11/30/15 Aggravated Assault (Domestic) – 100 block Morewood Avenue, 7:15am. A 36 year-old female victim reported that her estranged husband entered her home and began an argument, then hit her with his car as he was leaving. Officers learned that there was a PFA against the female and **both husband and wife were eventually arrested.** *The husband was charged with Aggravated Assault and the wife was charged with a PFA violation.* Their names are being withheld since they are both considered victims as well and we do not release victim information. 12/2/15 Business Robbery – Armstrong Auto Body - 5470 Penn Avenue, 3:00pm. Three victims working at the business reported two unknown suspects entered the auto body shop wearing masks and demanded money. The actors stole money from the safe then walked down Penn Avenue. **One suspect is a black male, approximately 5'7", 190 Lbs, stocky build, wearing black pants and a white shirt. The other suspect is a black male, 6'0" 180 Lbs, medium build, wearing black pants and a black hooded sweatshirt.** VCU (Violent Crime Unit) is investigating. (230676)

Stanton Heights/Morningside/Highland Park/East Liberty

11/29/15 Theft from Vehicle / Suspicious Male – 5600 block Rural Street, 3:15pm. Officers responded to an attempted car break-in. Victim reported she happened to be looking out her window when she saw (3) suspects enter her driveway and attempt to get into her vehicle. The victim grabbed her keys and set off the panic alarm, at which point the males fled. The victim went to call 911 at which point she saw two of the suspects return and get into her vehicle. She again set off the alarm, at which point the males fled again. **The suspects were all described as black males, 15-20 years old, one was wearing a red & blue Giants jacket.** (228757)

11/30/15 Robbery – 5601 Penn Avenue, 6:30pm. A 51 year-old female victim reported that her granddaughter came to her apartment to visit. While there, her granddaughter, **Kearmani Bogan, 17,** asked her for money. When the victim refused, Bogan tried to pull her purse from her shoulder. The victim held onto her purse, at which point Bogan pulled a gun out of her backpack, pointed it at her grandmother's head, and demanded her money. Bogan then stole the money from the purse, threatened to kill her grandmother, then fled the apartment. Officers will be obtaining an arrest warrant for Bogan. *She will be charged as an adult with Robbery and Terroristic Threats.* (229519)

12/1/15 Burglary – Lou Iezzi Auto Body – 5703 Bryant Street, Occurred between 11/30 at 5:15pm and 12/1 at 7:15am. Victim arrived at his business to find the front door had been forced open and unknown items were taken. (229783)

12/2/15 Robbery – McDonald’s Restaurant - 148 N. Euclid Avenue, 6:45pm.

A 69 year-old male victim told officers he was sitting inside the McDonald’s working on his laptop when the suspect approached him and snatched his computer out of his hands. The suspect fled on foot but security cameras may have captured the incident. The suspect is a black male, approximately 17 years-old. A witness to the incident believes the suspect’s name is “Josh” and he used to work at the restaurant. Zone 5 detectives are investigating. 12/3/15 Overdose / Endangering Welfare of Children – Greenwood Street & Swan Way, 6:00pm.

Officers responded to an unresponsive female inside a vehicle. They arrived to find **Jamie L. Hudak, 32, of Morningside**, inside her vehicle, disoriented. Hudak had her 8 year-old daughter with her and was out doing errands when she stopped to inject heroin, and overdosed. Hudak was found in possession of drug paraphernalia (needles and used stamp bags of heroin). *She was placed under arrest and charged with Endangering Welfare of Children and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.* It should be noted that Hudak admitted to officers she just purchased heroin along with a friend of hers. Officers found that friend dead of a heroin overdose just minutes earlier at his nearby residence. (231382)

12/6/15 Theft from Vehicle – 900 block Heberton Street. Victim stated she found her center console open and several credit cards and gift cards missing. Victim stated her vehicle was accidentally left unlocked. (233099)

12/5/15 Burglary - Lou Iezzi Auto Body – 5703 Bryant Street. Victim reported his business was burglarized overnight but nothing was taken. A security camera captured images of the burglar. (232368)

12/6/15 Robbery – 5400 block Stanton Avenue, 10:00pm. A 54 year-old female victim reported that she was walking to the store to get cigarettes when she was robbed on Livery Way. The victim stated she was struck on the head by an unknown suspect(s) then heard them asking her for money and jewelry. The victim stated she handed over her rent money that she had on her person. The suspects fled and there is no description at this time. (233499)

12/6/15 Burglary – Family Vision Care – 5917 Penn Avenue, 7:17pm. Officers responded to a burglar alarm at this location and arrived to find the front glass door had been shattered. Once the owner arrived on scene, officers found that cash had been taken from the store. Officers were able to view footage of the burglar on the store’s security camera and were able to positively identify the burglar as **Tino Malik Hunter, 40, of Friendship**. Officers obtained an arrest warrant for Hunter and on 12/7/15, our detectives were able to locate and arrest him. *Hunter was charged with Burglary.* (233428)



Notable Arrests

12/1/15 at 11:45am – 2200 block Wilner Drive (East Hills): Allegheny County Probation & Parole officers went to an address in the 2200 block of Wilner Drive to conduct a compliance check on **Baron Noaks, 33, of East Hills**. The probation officer found Noaks at his residence, in possession of (123) stamp bags of heroin, a stolen Beretta 9mm handgun, (47) rounds of ammo, and \$3,550.00 cash. Zone 5 officers responded to the scene and placed Noaks under arrest. *He was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance, Possession with Intent to Deliver a Controlled Substance, and Receiving Stolen Property.
