Homewood / East Hills

4/25/17 Burglary – 1200 block Nolan Court. (74948)

4/26/17 Stolen Vehicle – Bennett Street & N. Murtland Street. Victim reported that someone stole her 2004 orange Pontiac Grand Prix from in-front of her residence. It was later recovered after being involved in a crash outside of the city. (75351)

4/27/17 Theft from Vehicle – N. Homewood Avenue & Frankstown Avenue. (76016)

4/29/17 Aggravated Assault (Domestic) - 7200 block Kelly Street, 11: 15 AM. A 26 year-old female victim reported that **Aleeyah Thomason, 22, of Wilkinsburg**, appeared at her door along with another, unknown female, and struck her in the face with a brick. Thomason was apparently looking for her boyfriend. The female suspects fled but officers will obtain an arrest warrant for Thomason. The victim sustained minor facial injuries. (77580)

4/29/17 Robbery / Witness Intimidation – 2200 block Wilner Drive, 4:45 PM. Officers met with a 34 year-old female victim who reported that she was assaulted and threatened by a male she knows from the neighborhood. The victim stated that the male, **Jeremy Neal, 25, of the West End**, threatened her regarding an upcoming court case, then pulled her chair out from under her and ripped some of her clothes off of her. The victim ran to safety and called 911. Officers arrived in the area and spotted Neal. Neal fled on foot but officers caught him and took him into custody. On the way to jail, Neal told officers that if he ever saw them off-duty he would kill them. (77762)

4/25/17 Strangulation / Simple Assault (Domestic) - 4900 block Kincaid Street, 6:15 AM. A 33 year-old female victim reported that she was involved in an argument with her brother, **Daniel Onan Eric Johnson, 31, of Garfield**. The argument turned violent when Johnson threw the victim to the floor, choked her, then pulled a gun and threatened to kill the victim and her

children. Johnson fled before officers arrived. Officers responded to the area and began searching for Johnson. About 90 minutes later, he was located at the corner of Kincaid Street & N. Winebiddle and taken into custody. He did not have a firearm in his possession when arrested. (74557)

4/25/17 Robbery (Domestic) – Broad Street & N. Euclid Avenue, 1:00 AM. Officers responded to a domestic violence call and arrived to find a 32 year-old male victim who indicated that he was involved in an argument with his 34 year-old boyfriend while they were driving. According to the victim, his boyfriend would not allow him to exit the car and began driving recklessly. Once the vehicle came to a stop, the victim exited with his belongings. The suspect grabbed the victim's belongings and fled in his vehicle with the items. Officers will obtain an arrest warrant for **Frankie Sabatka, 34, of Youngstown, OH.** (74471)

4/27/17 Man with a Gun – Portland Street & Stanton Avenue, 3:29 PM. Officer responded to a 911 call for a shirtless male with a gun walking in the 900 block of Portland Street. Upon arriving in the area, the officers saw a **male, 24, of Highland Park,** matching the description given by the 911 caller. The male had a gun sticking out of his waistband and was verbally confrontational with the officers. The male was detained briefly until officers could verify his identity and that he did have a license for the firearm. He was then sent on his way. (76266)

4/29/17 Robbery / Aggravated Assault – 700 block Mellon Street, 1:25 AM. Officers responded to a report of an armed robbery and arrived to speak with two female victims who indicated that an unknown male suspect in a red hooded sweatshirt just robbed them at gunpoint. The victims indicated that the suspect had a shotgun and demanded their belongings. The suspect then fled on foot. Moments later, responding officers encountered the male, who was still armed with the shotgun. The male refused to obey commands and was shot by officers. **The male was taken into custody.** His identity is being withheld until he is released from the hospital and formally charged. Notable Arrests

4/24/17 at 5:13 PM – Allegheny Cemetery (Garfield): Zone 5 Detectives Joliet, Poling, and Livesey were investigating a complaint of people using drugs in the Allegheny Cemetery. Detectives arrived in the area and saw the vehicle in question. When the detectives approached the vehicle, the driver attempted to pull off as the occupants discarded a crack pipe and a bag of crack out the window. Detectives were able to stop the car a short distance away and detained the occupants. The crack was recovered and additional drugs were found in the car. Detectives arrested **Elise N. Feroce, 31, of Lower Burrell, and Anthony J. Barlow, 51, of Garfield.** (74267)

4/25/17 at 11:10 PM – 7300 block Kelly Street (Homewood): Zone 5 Officers Taylor and Dettling were conducting license plate checks when they received an alert that the owner of the vehicle traveling in front of them, Taylor Jefferson, was wanted on an outstanding warrant for a violent domestic that occurred on 3/29/17. The officers conducted a traffic stop to investigate further and positively identified the driver as **Taylor Jefferson, 24, of Penn Hills.** While Officer Dettling was speaking with Jefferson at the driver's door, Officer Taylor (positioned at the passenger door) saw Jefferson pulling a gun out of his right pants pocket. Officer Taylor quickly drew her gun and ordered Jefferson to stop and show his hands. The officers quickly secured the gun and took Jefferson into custody. It was later learned that, in addition to the warrant, Jefferson is prohibited from possessing firearms based on his criminal history. He was charged with felony firearms violations in addition to the domestic warrant. Thanks to the excellent teamwork of Officers Taylor and Dettling, a tragedy was avoided and another gun is off the streets! (75087)

4/26/17 at 8:04 PM – 7212 Everton Street (Lincoln-Lemington): Zone 5 Officers Taylor and Dettling responded to a call for two state constables who were working a security detail in the Everton Street housing development when they encountered a man with a gun. Constables saw **Deshaun J. McGeorge, 25, of Wilksburg,** in the hallway of the apartment building, and could see a gun with an extended clip sticking out of his pants. McGeorge fled but was tackled by the constables. He was detained and the gun was recovered. McGeorge was arrested by Zone 5 officers and charged with Firearms Not to be Carried without a License.
